HOODOOS



A hoodoo is a tall, thin spire of rock that sticks up from the ground. They range in size from the height of an average human to heights exceeding a 10-story building. For millions of years, hoodoo shapes have been alternating hard and soft rock layers with various mineral deposits within that give them vibrant coloring throughout their height. Shapes are formed through the erosion of water and wind that continue to carve at the rocks today.


While hoodoos are scattered throughout the world, nowhere else are they so abundant as in Bryce Canyon National Park.
